ETPL: Lesley Hirsh

- 1. Unit is down 2 staff & look to fill positions.
- 2. Hiring a consultant to oversee unit and Lesley will continue as Supervisor
- 3. Renewals taking up to 60 days, new applications about 90 days
- 4. Apprenticeships should on ETPL but not sure if Pre-Apprenticeships need to be on ETPL. Lesley will look into this. There is no section J's for Apprenticeships.

WFNJ customers need to be assessed. Letters to included that they will be outreached for an assessment. WFNJ will be implemented with a phased in approached to mandatory work activity. Interviews to be conducted by phone (working to update regulations). CSA's will be conducted by phone & in person (trying to be flexible if possible). Melissa B will find out what will happen if the customer doesn't participate in the CSA.
- 4. Diane Seavers: SNAP E&T voluntary and will not be disqualified. Discussions still taking place.

- 6. Melissa B. Virtual & Hybrid programs are good but need a mechanism to track hours.
